# 5. **Principal's Report** – Megan Egerton **Construction**

- Finished year 1 of a three year plan
- Electrical panel updated to allow window AC units in the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor this spring
- Lowered ceiling in 2<sup>nd</sup> floor to allow duct work for AC install next summer

#### **Student Numbers**

- 624 students this year and 28 classes (564 students last year)
- 5 Kinder classes (22-23 in each class)
- 9 Grade 1-3 classes
- 6 Grade 4-6 classes (biggest classes are grade 6 at 31 students each)
- 5 Grade 7-8 classes
- 3 ASD classes

Operational Budget will be presented at the October Council meeting

#### **Labour Action**

- ETFO (teachers) and OSSTF (admin, EAs, ECEs, support staff, custodians) are both without an agreement. Any updates will come from the board.
- Work to Rule would be the first labour action and means staff only do what is in their job description (yard duty, teaching, supervision etc). No clubs, extracurriculars, sports, band, etc

## Student Pickups during the day

- Office staff cannot have students ready for pickup at a specific time. Often the student is waiting, and teaching time is lost. We are now asking parents to alert teacher of an early departure (email, dojo etc) and they will have student ready. When parent arrives, the class will be called, and the student sent down immediately. If the class cannot be found, the student will be paged to the office.
- Last minute calls to get a student ready for a non-emergency departure is extremely time consuming for the office and disruptive to the class. Please try to avoid early pickups if not absolutely necessary.
