School Council Meeting Minutes

22 parents present, 1 administrator (Pascale), 2 teachers (Anthony, Leslie) = 25

1. Welcome and Introductions

Round table of introductions by all present

Committee Reports

- 1.1 OCASC Maggie Green: provided update that a school council can raise funds for another school and provide funds or activity/items to another school.
- 1.2 Safe Travel Planning Tricia Ross: discussed feasibility of seeking additional stanchions high traffic or necessary areas. Reports of traffic challenges need to be reported to 311 the local Bay Ward Counsellor, Theresa Kavanagh. Vehicles should not be stopping at the back of the school (on Lockhart) to drop off as it is a no parking/stopping zone. A request was made for the school to send a reminder to parents and students that everyone under the age of 18 is required by law to wear a helmet.
- 1.3 Multicultural and Arts **volunteer needed** who would be responsible for finding and booking programming for grade 3 and under population. In the interim Sarah Futterer has agreed to coordinate Yaki (kinder musician) and Chinese Dragon (grade 1) programs.
- 1.4 Healthy Active Kids Julie Findlay: a request is being put forth for tchoukball, size 5 soccer balls.
- 1.5 Student Well Being volunteer needed; Tricia Ross has volunteered to be a back up.
- 1.6 Garden Committee Carley Schelck: absent, no report sent.
- 1.7 Outreach Committee (outreach would be targeted to benefit other schools) Kirstin Graystone, Dayle Kline, and Melanie Rushworth volunteered to form the outreach committee and will explore how we begin outreach planning to another school. The budget passed allocating ten percent of all funds raised this school year in support of outreach activities.
- 1.8 Fundraising Coordinator Daniela Humeniuk: estimate of \$20,000 needs to be fundraised to support the proposed programming.
- 1.9 Communications Coordinator Jen St-Pierre: our School Council page has not been rerouted to be accessible through the WAPS homepage.

2. Upcoming Fundraising Events

2.1 Movie Nights – volunteer needed to work with Cindy Rutley. Next movie night is Friday, October 25 and we are showing the live action film, Aladdin. Tickets are \$5/person and include Carlingwood KERNELS popcorn. Approximately 110 people attended the September movie night, fairly steady participation and numbers. Discussed some ideas to encourage the older students to attend, such as alternating live action with animated movies. Also discussed using a Facebook or Survey Monkey poll to get some direct feedback from students. Mme. Desrosiers

- has also gotten involved in movie nights in an environmental way she will provide composting and recycling at movie nights and her goal is to work towards zero waste.
- 2.2 Plant Nite Sarah Futterer: Thursday, November 21 at The Clocktower on Richmond Road, \$60/ticket, 7-9pm. In order for the even to run, we need to sell at least 25 tickets by November 7. WAPS School Council earns \$15 from each ticket.
- 2.3 Craft Sale Tricia Ross and Stephanie Duffy: Saturday, November 30; school council usually runs the bake sale/food booth at this event and last year we pulled in approximately \$1,000.

Soccer Club – form sent, for students from grades 1-8, 30 kids max, \$30 for the season, runs Tuesdays 6:30-8pm.

Ski Club – at Vorlage (Wakefield, Qc.) on Fridays. This year Vorlage has taken over the program and are responsible for tickets so there will be no surplus. New model limits the ability to subsidize the program as we have done in the past; we have enough in the budget to subsidize for another year for sure, and maybe up to 3 years. It's a very popular program with 97 students attending last year along, and an average over the years of 66 participants a year. We generally subsidize ~5 students a year. Discussion from Daryl Stall also about council having a subsidy pot. We tabled further discussion to the November meeting on how to continue fundraising. Program will proceed this year.
