# **COUNCIL MEETINGS**

Following an election held in September 2019, the Annual General Meeting to set the agenda and budget for the year was held in October. A morning meeting was added to expand outreach to a wider audience in November 2019, followed by a January 2020 meeting. More social and informal gatherings of the council took place in December 2019 and February 2020. Based upon discussions at the February gathering the school council executive informed the principal of a decision to return play yard funds that were being held by the council to the school administration funds. The remaining planned meetings were cancelled due to either labour action and the closure of schools in March 2020.

In total there were four official Council meetings. All meetings included the following standard reports:

#### **FUNDRAISING EVENTS:**

Back to School Picnic: Sept 17, 2019

Movie Nights: five family movie nights were planned for Friday evenings during the school year. Not all were possible due to labour action and the pandemic closure.

Craft Fair Canteen: November 30, 2019

Used Book Sale: February 26-27, and open to the public on February 29, 2020

Cake Fundraiser: cancelled due to labour action

Plant and Water Barrel sale: cancelled due to pandemic closure

Spring Fling: cancelled due to pandemic closure

Yearbooks were also sold as a fundraiser this year and delivered by volunteers due to the pandemic closure.

Community Outreach — Based upon council direction at the AGM, 10 percent of all proceeds from fundraising activities (\$6237.70) in 2019-2020 were to be directed to Pinecrest Public School to assist with their in-school programming. This funding of \$623.77 was not transferred due to the pandemic but remains available for use at their discretion and in coordination with the school principal. This funding should appear as a line item in the 2020-2021 budget.

#### PROGRAMMING WORKSHOPS:

In a typical year the School Council supports Scientist in Schools workshops for all classes; however, this was cancelled due to pandemic closure.

Similarly, the Cultivating Cooks food literacy workshops for Grade 3 classes and a Pass it On workshop for Grade 1 and 6 students cancelled due to pandemic closure.
